Welcome to a seminar where Constanza Gasparo will talk about how she used creative and participatory methods to narrate, analyze and imagine inclusive cities. Starting from the work of Henri Lefebvre, the seminar will explore the right to the city for migrants. Through examples of research and projects carried out in various urban contexts, the seminar will highlight both material and symbolic barriers that limit access to urban spaces and full citizenship.
